**Subject:** Dominion Power Plant expansion

Dear Ms. Riggleman,

I respectfully request that the Dominion Power Plant expansion proposal be reviewed by the State Air Pollution Control Board. Air quality is the biggest problem threatening the Shenandoah National park. Hazy views diminish visitors' experience and acid rain harms the Parks streams and forests. Air pollution has already dramatically limited visibility from the park, down to an average of only 25 miles, where once people could see for more than 100 miles.

Additionally, the Department of Environmental Quality should solicit comments from other state agencies tasked with protecting scenic and historic resources in order to address impacts from the power plant which, as proposed, would have three 175-foot smokestacks, along with onsite electric transmission facilities (up to 160ft), an auxiliary boiler stack (up to 155ft), an air cooled condenser (up to 145ft) and a heat recovery steam generator (up to 120ft).
