I urge DEQ and the Air Board to consider the cumulative impacts of this proposed new power station when reviewing their permit. There clearly will be cumulative impacts on CO2 emissions, fugitive emissions of methane (both locally and in the upstream fuel cycle) and stack emissions of other VOCs and NOx on local and regional air quality.

The Air Board also should consider cumulative impact on total CO2 emissions, which will be contrary to the efforts of the Governor and DEQ to reduce CO2 emissions from the power industry and the state more generally as well as to U.S. efforts to curb CO2 globally. It will make it more difficult to meet our goals under the state's ED 11 cap and trade program under our RGGI cap and contribute to extra costs for Virginia power consumers since more auction credits will have to be purchased. Recent scientific analyses from the IPCC, the U.S. National Climate Assessment, and voluminous reports from the scientific literature make it clear that we must begin cutting emissions of CO2 and other GHGs as soon as possible if we are to avoid the most serious impacts of global warming. How can the Board ignore those impacts? I urge the Board to protect our citizens by looking at this situation from the broader perspective of protecting our air quality and environment, not just the narrow perspective of existing regulations.
