Ms. Sinclair -

I am writing and asking the Air Pollution Control Board to do a thorough review of the permit for the proposed Chickahominy Power Station (Balico LLC;5261).

I am concerned about the project because the nearby community is a minority-majority county and already deals with disproportionate pollution coming from Hopewell's large industrial footprint. The area also has one of the largest concentration of Native Americans in the state.

This project cannot move forward without closer review, including air current studies and impact analysis, from the DEQ and the Air Board. The 1650 MWs that are supposed to be generated by this plant would also exacerbate the dangerous effects of climate change around the world and especially in Virginia. This project would wipe out positive steps made by the DEQ and Air Board, including draft regulations to join the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative.
