


SaMS Stakeholder Survey


(Nov. 2, 2017 – Feb. 14, 2018)

- 67 Respondents from all major Stakeholder Groups, with greatest participation by Environmental Groups and MS4s




Summary Notes on Survey Responses


- **Question 2:** How would you rate your awareness of the impacts from salt application used for winter weather maintenance activities
 - Most responded that they are aware of the impacts




- **Question 3:** Do you see opportunity to reduce impacts and maintain high levels of public safety?
 - 95% Yes
 - Narrative responses include many thoughtful ways to achieve this
- **Question 4:** How Concerned with Current Levels of Salt Use?
 - 97% indicated some concern; 43% selected “Very Concerned”




- **Question 5:** Issues of Concern to You
 - 65 of 66 respondents are concerned about Water Quality
 - 74-80% also concerned with impacts to Vegetation/Landscaping; Drinking Water; and Infrastructure
 - 64% concerned with Road Safety and 55% with Cost of Winter Maintenance




- **Question 6:** Level of Knowledge of Salt Use in Winter Maintenance
 - Almost evenly spread from none to expert, average 3 on a scale of 5
 - Narrative comments from those with greatest expertise provide rich resource for follow up discussions



- **Question 7:** Ways involved in Winter Salt Use
 - Water Quality Mgmt. greatest at 50%, Property Owner (in most cases, a personal residence) next at 43%, followed by Gov./Inst. Property Mgmt. (30%)
 - Road Maintenance Admin (22%), Infrastructure Mgmt. (17%), and Drinking Water Mgmt. (11%) next most common
 - Note in the figure below respondents can be involved in more than one role related to winter salt use



- Question 8: What would you like to see come out of SaMS?
 - Rich body of narrative comments
 - Categorized and included in a handout at the first SAC meeting
- Question 9: Rate the Proposed Components of SaMS
 - All proposed components had broad support
 - Highest for “Suite of BMPs” (62% rated “Critical”); with 44-47% rating “Effectiveness Monitoring of BMPs” and “Develop a Guiding Document” as “Critical”



- Question 10: Options for Participating
 - Most favor morning or afternoon meetings for detailed SaMS working sessions
